



Ah, fall. A time to reflect on the quickly passing days. To wonder where the year has gone and to look back on the failings and accomplishments of the past few months. As the days turn cooler I look around the shelter at the "aftermath" of a particularly long kitten season. The kennels are still full of rowdy, frisky kittens waiting for their turn on the adoption floor. As much as we all love kittens the reality of the cat overpopulation problem is all too obvious when you are dealing with an overcrowded shelter. We at the shelter don't want to be just a place for unwanted cats. We are dedicated to doing our part to help the overpopulation problem which is why we recently began to analyze our costs involved with our low cost spay/neuter clinic. After taking a hard look we were thrilled to find that we would be able to cut the cost of our

spays to \$40 and our neuters to \$25. It is our hope that these savings will enable even more people to take advantage of the clinic and through this we will see a much needed decline in the overall cat population. Our clinics are offered once a month and open to any cat. You must call to schedule an appointment as space is limited.
